MARK YOUR CALENDAR: Saturday, March 4 is Hummingbird Day at UCSC's Arboretum. Admission is \$10 for the general public, \$5 for Arboretum members, and free for UCSC students and children under 12. From 10 am to 4 pm, this fun-for-all event will include opportunities to watch hummingbirds in their natural habitat and a variety of activities focused on these wondrous creatures (see complete schedule):

- Activities for kids (children 7 and under must be accompanied by an adult): Take-home crafts (mobiles, masks, watercolors, necklaces, and seed balls), face-painting, and bird walks/play.
- Activities for all: Lectures and workshops on topics ranging from "Landscaping for Hummingbirds" to "Hummingbird Iridescence and Leucism," expert-led garden and beginning-birder tours, and a morning bird walk with Todd Newberry.

During this rain or shine event, you can purchase an assortment of delicious, healthy breakfast or lunch foods.
